January 2022 Board Meeting Report

COVID:

FEMA reimbursement paperwork for 2020 & 2021 clinics is being processed. They have changed Program Managers and I have learned they are all different in their methods. There is a possibility that they may ask for all the advance funding to be returned and put us into a different program for reimbursement. More to follow.

We have held Moderna booster clinics this last month for the public. As of now, those are probably the last ones.

We have a temporary SOG for our employees if they are sick at work, they will be tested before going home. If they test positive, there is additional items that need to be done.

Conflagration Reimbursement:

We received reimbursement for the following:

Jack Fire	\$ 41,227
Douglas County Preposition	\$ 27,852

Still waiting for reimbursement for three deployments totaling \$ 194,719.

EMS Report:

- 6 transports in December, ended the year with 62 ambulance transports
- FYI, Ambulance transport dollars received this budget year \$ 8,563
- 49 transports pending collections by PWA.

Budget Process:

Started working on 22-23 Budget. Have a pretty good idea on the income side. We have sent out forms for budget requests to all staff and volunteers. There is already an increase of 12% on liability insurance, 4% on dispatch services, and the inherent cost of goods and services has increased about 5%.

Building and Equipment Maintenance:

Damage to HR-16. Hit a boulder in the roadway when responding to a call. This is an insurance claim. No estimate for the damage yet.

T-12 has hose bed cover being built. E-13 has new mirrors and rear damage to be repaired.

Bob is working on interior projects. Flooring, new maintenance area, painting at FS-16. Lighting and fixture repairs. New vehicle numbering and decals.

Kenny is busy with vehicle preventative maintenance and older vehicle repairs.

Alarm Response:

December 2021 alarm responses 265. December 2020 alarm responses 228, an increase of 17% over December last year. For the year 2021 we ended with 3,372 calls for an average of 9.2 per day. **A record setting year.** Overall, 2021 was higher by 566 calls for the year over last year, a 20% increase.

Grant Applications:

No response back on SDAO Safety and Security Grant.

SAFER and AFG grant cycles are currently open. We have not submitted for either.

Supply Chain Issues:

Over the last 6-8 months, we have begun to experience supply chain problems. Ordering PPE, medical supplies, new engine equipment. SDAO and OFCA has asked all agencies and Districts to keep their Board informed about the problems for budget and planning purposes. We were lucky with our Engine orders. Waiting for PPE for 7 months now. It is also affecting daily equipment and supply issues.

District Annexations:

January 5 the County BOC approved the annexation of the three properties into our District at their regular meeting. I think it is to our advantage over contract for services.

We still have 9 properties in Roads End and will be sending a letter about no response.

Bond Purchases:

Direct Capture Exhaust System for FS-16 is installed. I will submit to FEMA for AFG money, \$76,190. The balance of \$12,522 will come out of Bond funds.

Held the prebuild conference with Hughes Fire for the two new Type-1 Engines. No updates on pricing. Estimated delivery in July.

WUI Engine is coming along. Estimated delivery in February.

Equipment ordering is taking place. So far: Radios – Deck Guns – Intake valves

Remote Access Required for All Public Meetings – Beginning January 1, 2022

During the 2021 session, the Oregon Legislature passed [House Bill 2560](#) which requires governing bodies to make meetings accessible remotely and provide opportunity for members of the general public to remotely submit oral and written testimony to the extent reasonably possible. This requirement does *not* apply to executive sessions. Ways that districts can offer remote access to meetings include:

- Telephone
- Using video or other electronic or virtual means

We are following this now using the GoToMeeting platform. However, we will update our Policy 4.3. That appears to be the most appropriate section.

Personnel and Hiring:

Cody Peterson's last day was January 1; Dennis Knudson's last day was December 31. Another volunteer, Jessie Nunn, resigned after being here 6 months.

We have two new volunteers who have passed backgrounds and are completing physicals and drug screens.

Caden McCall's last day of his temporary PT is January 31. He will move back to being a volunteer FF.

For the interim, we have offered two positions, Temporary PT. They are currently in backgrounds and physicals.

Started the hiring process for the new positions slated to begin in July. Job is posted with National Testing Network, in OFCA Daily dispatch, and in the local paper for two weeks. This application process closes March 18th with assessment center in early April.
